The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Jim Bender

Rod & Roger have been working on Trail 22 & 24. There have been many people inquiring about the Tri County Corridor. Our club does not grade or maintain the corridor. That is the responsibility of the Tri County Corridor Committee who meets on the First Monday of the Month at the Iron River Community Center. Complaints should be directed to them. Rod discussed the Pavilion that is to be built off Trail 31 at the pull off by the Rest Area. The blue prints are ready so this will go out on bids. We are hoping this will be done by August. Rod also spoke on the stuffed animals that will soon be out on the trails with prizes to be won. This is also an attempt to get people to slow down and enjoy the trails and scenery. Rod also reported that the saw they have been using needs to be replaced. He suggested that they should purchase an electric saw. Jim asked if there were any objections to the executive committee making the decision on the purchase of the saw. There were no objections.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Jim started off showing the beautiful plaque that our club was presented with at the WATVA meeting held in April in Stevens Point. Jim also discussed that he plans on attending the Iron River Town Board meeting held Thursday night to discuss further access to Hwy H up to Wayside Road, and also to change the McCarry Lake Road entrance & exit on the current trail. Next on the agenda Jim discussed the Bayfield Cty Fair signup sheet for those people interested in working. Fair will be held August 8, 9, 10, 11th, Our club receives \$5.00 hr for work done by the club members at the gates. They are usually 3 hour shifts. Contact Jim if you are interested in helping out. Jim then discussed the garbage pickup that was done on the trails last Saturday June 1st that was started by Birch Grove camp ground and ended at Birch Grove with a lunch. It was attended by 16 volunteers that covered 70 miles of trail and they collected 130 lbs of garbage a TV, and 2 cement blocks. This was a great success please if you see litter on the trails please stop and pick it up. This will become an annual event on our Spring calendar.

CARE COMMITTEE: Julie gave the care committee report that she sent a card out to Judy at Judy's Drift Inn as she had been in the hospital, and Eddie Wangemsteen had some surgery so a card was also sent his way. Tonight's drawing is for the basket provided by Ino Bar.
